

## Networking to Grow Spirit in the Desert

Nola Mellstrom was appointed to the Board of Directors in 2018, bringing her management and people skills from her nursing career to Spirit in the Desert.

She grew up in the small town of Roseau, Minnesota near the Canadian border, a town well-known for its youth hockey programs. Nola attended St. Olaf College for two years and completed her nursing degree at Minneapolis General Hospital.
