

## Dr. Glenn Schrader Energized for Growth and Leadership for Spirit's Future

"I was hooked right away when I attended "The Third Chapter of Life," my first retreat at Spirit in the Desert, about five or six years ago," said Glenn Schrader, PhD, a retired professor of chemical engineering who lives in Tucson, Arizona.
